

### **Shelburne Town Meeting Notes**

Date: May 30, 2006

Ben Mayerson opened the meeting at 7 PM with a brief introduction to the project. David Laurin presented building program observations in power point format and comments and questions from the audience were entertained. There were approx. 23 people in attendance including committee members. Some noteworthy points are as follows:

1. Distance Learning Lab: It was suggested that the distance-learning lab be the same size as a standard high school classroom ( 800 sf).
2. Science Classrooms: There was a question as to how many science rooms were adequate to satisfy the educational curriculum (the concern was that there may not be enough proposed).
3. Showers: How many are planned? Do the team rooms get showers or just the general locker rooms? It was explained that only a sf area had been assigned to the locker area and how the showers were to be distributed would be determined during design.
4. Parking: How much parking is adequate?
5. Stage / Auditorium vs. Cafetorium: How much bigger would the cafeteria be to handle a "cafetorium" model?
6. After School Center: Should the school be an "after school center" for students?
7. Shelter: Would the new / renovated facility be a shelter for use by the towns?
8. Admin Areas: It was suggested that only the total area be given to the administrators and faculty to allow them to design how the space should work. Allow for a lot of user input in other words.
9. Grade Configuration. The question about flexibility in grade configuration came up in terms of ability to adjust to changes in population in the future.

MS/HS Location: Consensus was to keep the current location if at all possible.
